Myriah Noble, pool manger, gave a pool report. As of June 14, 2018, pool has averaged 34 attendees per day and 17 attendees per night. Everything is going well; float night scheduled July 11, 2018 from 7 – 10 pm.

Nicole Peterson, SIMPCO, discussed with Council the adoption of the 2018 Municipal Comprehensive Plan.

Johnson made motion to approve Resolution #18-15 ***“Resolution Adopting 2018 Municipal Comprehensive Plan”***, second by Baker. Roll Call vote “aye” Redig, Johnson, Baker, Stroud “nay” none. Motion carried. Nelson Absent.

Public Works Report was reviewed. Pool leak fixed and up and running; new pool signs installed; discharged from lagoon; trees removed & stumps ground in park; mowed; installed

new hydrant at 7th & Walnut. Council requested Bonnesen Plumbing complete storm drain project.

- A. Employee Comp Time was discussed. Currently Wieland has 40 hours of comp time and Sangwin has 9.26 hours. Council encouraged using up as much as possible, remaining hours will be paid on June 28, 2018 check.

Asbestos removal by Wheeler Contracting, Inc. was discussed. Redig reported other avenues are being explored.

Police Report was discussed.

Clerks Report was discussed.

City slogan results were discussed. Council requested giving project back to Economic Development.

Council will host Community Coffee Wednesday, July 11th.

Messerole will be absent from July 16th Council meeting. Deputy Clerk will fill in.

An estimate from ProElect in amount of \$3,267.48 for installation of a fire alarm system in Heritage Society building. Heritage building shares a common wall with the Library, Redig felt a fire alarm system would be a good idea. After further discussion, Baker made motion to approve installation of fire alarm system in Heritage Society building, city paying cost, second by Johnson. All members present voting "aye" motion carried.

Landfill was discussed.

There being no further business to discuss, meeting was adjourned.
